Farming Pioneers Found European Alliance for Regenerative Agriculture at Schloss Kirchberg

For two days, 50 of the most advanced farmers of regenerative agriculture from more than 20 countries across Europe have convened at Schloss Kirchberg to self-organize in a coordination and political advocacy alliance. This conference is the culmination of an accelerating urgency and a growing regenerative community in Europe and beyond.

It is more imperative than ever to farm for regeneration – for nutrient–dense, resilient and high yields through farming for biodiversity and ecological functions.

EARA serves to make the voices of farming pioneers central in relevant political discourses towards the urgently needed regenerative transformation of our agri-food ecosystems. At the conference a common mission, vision and organizational institution to enable coordination and policy advocacy have been established.

The alliance aims at guiding political and economic decision-making in the EU member states and in EU institutions and corporations, and to prevent industries from dominating the discourse on defining regenerative agriculture. It is self-evident that its defining principles need to be shaped by the pioneers of regenerative agriculture.

The four defining principles for stewarding towards Regenerative Agriculture EARA is declaring are the following:

- Regeneration is an outcome-oriented process regarding social, ecological and economic health
- Regeneration is context-specific
- 3. Regeneration is a life-enhancing process, rather than a permanent state, which is evolving within context
- 4. Regeneration is systemic

EARA is currently working on a White Paper for a Regenerative Agri-food Ecosystem in Europe which will be presented at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Dubai (COP28). EARA will develop a farmer and soil health centred proposal for the CAP post-2027. We advocate for a CAP that can build fairness, planning security, debureaucratization and performance-based remuneration for farmers while growing resilience and innovation in agricultural production through socio-ecological regeneration for multiple benefits to farmers, people and the planet alike.

Background

Farmers across Europe are under heavy pressure from climate change, bureaucratic burdens, labour shortages and other factors. Farmers and citizens alike suffer from growing market and power asymmetries in agri-food ecosystems.

The current governance mode fails to facilitate the needed socio-ecological trend reversals. Competing policy narratives employed to facilitate the trend reversals have led to a practical deadlock of agricultural policy. The regenerative transformation is impeded by a practice-based and short-term policy approach that alienates farmers who are struggling to plan for security in a volatile market environment.
